## IIIT-Delhi's Students Organised Summer Camp for the Government school kids in College Campus

New Delhi, 15<sup>th</sup> June 2017: B. Tech students of Indraprastha Institute of Information Technology Delhi (IIIT-Delhi) started the session of annual summer camp during the summer break for students of government schools to enhance their interpersonal and soft skills at IIIT-Delhi campus. School students of the 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> standard from nearby schools of IIIT-Delhi's campus, namely Harkesh Nagar, LajpatNagar, Kalkaji, Govindpuri and other localities were invited to attend the workshop. Undergraduates went to various nearby schools and motivated the young students to participate in the summer school at IIIT-Delhi. 120 students from 5 schools took part in summer school program this year, namely; Govt. Boys' Senior Secondary School, Harkesh Nagar; Govt. Girls' Senior Secondary School, Harkesh Nagar; Govt. Boys' Senior Secondary School, Kalkaji; RPVV, Lajpat Nagar; Veer Savarkar Sarvodya Kanya Vidyalaya, No. 1, Kalkaji.

On the final day of the five weeks long Camp, an interactive session led by **Delhi Education Minister, Mr. Manish Sisodia** was held, in which students expressed their experiences and learning during the summer school. **Prof. Pankaj Jalote, Director, IIIT-Delhi** also showed gratitude at the event.

The day ended with prizes and certificate distribution, fantastic skits and an incredible show by all the students. Art and science exhibition was also organized by the students today where they displayed excellent artwork done by them. The students also presented working science models based on the concepts they learned in 5-week summer camp.

According to Mr. Manish Sisodia, "This was a humble initiative by our B. Tech students, who have chosen to spend their summer holidays in a better way to promote and help students from government schools through imparting necessary knowledge and skills. This experience will always motivate the school kids, and they will always remember this experience."

School kids, especially from 8th and 9th standards were taught on various skills like computer, GK, Problem-Solving skills, Mathematics, Science, Personality Development and Communication in the summer school. The kids were also provided with snacks and health drinks in the lunch time besides helping them teaching to pursue their hobbies such as dancing, theater, sports, singing, craft, etc.

Indraprastha Institute of Information Technology, Delhi (aka. IIIT-Delhi or IIIT-D) was created as a State University by an act of Delhi Government (<u>The IIIT Delhi Act, 2007</u>) empowering it to do research and development and grant degrees. IIIT-Delhi was officially established on 10th June 2008 as per <u>this notification</u> in the Delhi Gazette. First class (for BTech(CSE) students) was held on 8th September 2008.
